- Discuss availability and integration of data at national and subnational levels, and how available information is being used to strengthen programme implementation.
- Agree on priority actions to advance ECD-relevant measurement at the country level, as well as the supportive role of regional and global entities.



Expected outcomes

- Countries are oriented and equipped to use data from available and forthcoming measurement and monitoring tools to monitor progress in ECD.
- Country-level and regional mappings of data are used to influence policy, budgeting, and programming for ECD.
- A regional roadmap to guide countries on how they can mainstream/ integrate monitoring of ECD into their national statistical systems is developed.
- Country-specific action plans to strengthen monitoring of programme implementation and children's development outcomes are developed.
