# Monitoring Progress in Implementation of ECD Policies, Kenya

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## Kenya's Policy Environment

- Children's Act 2022: the main law that safeguards the rights and welfare of children in Kenya.
- Section 41 of the Children Act, 2022 created the National Council for Children's Services (NCCS), under the Ministry of Labour and Social Protection to coordinate, regulate and oversight children's services in Kenya
- Implementation is Multisectoral
- Health sector guided by ECD policy, Health Policy and the Kenya Health Sector Strategic Plan (KHSSP)
- Policy 2017, the National Education Sectoral Strategic Plan(NESSP) and the Pre-Primary Policy Standards and Guidelines 2018

### Data Systems -Routine

Kenya Health Information System (KHIS) – Aggregate data collected from registers at various service delivery points

National Education Management Information System –

(from primary education level but planned inclusion of preprimary education)

- Headteachers input data into the system
- Key elements include school enrolment, attendance, transition, learning materials, WASH facilities, teacher numbers, Teacher pupil ratio, teacher –Basic education statistical booklet
- Civil Registration and Vital Statistics Registration of births and deaths
- Child Protection Management Information System- Tracks
  Data on cases of violence against children, caregiving,
  adoption and foster care

- Joint Sector Review of the National Education Sectoral Plan (September 2023)
- National Survey on Pre-Primary Education in Kenya- to be done in January 2024

#### Indicators- Education

Joint sector review of NESSP

- Gross enrolment in pre-primary education for children 4 to 5 years 99% due to free education
- The Gross Enrolment Rate(GER) for boys was 111.5, while for girls, the GER was 110.8.
- The marginal increase in the GER from 109.4 in 2019 to 111.2 in 2020 indicates that children are yet to access pre-primary education at the right age, with increasing numbers of underage and over-age learners in schools;
  - Teacher ratio: Public 1:55, Private 1:21 in sampled schools against recommended 1:25




#### Indicators- Education

Joint sector review of NESSP

- Improvised play-based materials in a few schools 10%
- Inadequate and appropriate WASH facilities learner toilet ratio was very high i.e. 34:1against recommended 10:1 girls, 1.15 boys urinal
- Most pre-schools did not have inclusive education-Special Needs Education



# Opportunities



- NCCS is spearheading the completion of the National ECD Policy 2022. Key aspects of the policy:
  - National ECD Strategic Plan will have components of health, education and social protection
  - National ECD M&E Framework through which ECD indicators will be tracked and inform program implementation
  - National Technical Steering Committee on ECD to facilitate effective and efficient multisectoral collaboration and coordination



## Opportunities

- Kenya is currently strengthening PHC, through support to strengthen CHU and paying of CHP, and formation of primary care networks (PCN)
- Community Health Promoters have a high potential to educate mothers and caregivers on NC for ECD during household visits
- Use of Mother Child Handbook
- jdentifying children with delayed milestones
- Collecting data 'Children with delayed developmental milestones referred' MOH 514. Strengthen community to health facility referral systems
